Orphan X Series by Gregg Hurwitz

“Do you need my help?” That’s what anyone who calls Orphan X’s encrypted phone line will hear. Orphan X is the product of a secret government program that trained orphan children to become assassins. “X” as he is called by the people who know him, has left the orphan program (a fact the government is not happy about). He now helps those who are desperate for help and in need of his unique skill set. He never accepts payment, he only asks the person he has helped to pass his number along to someone else in an equally despairing situation.

The Orphan X books and audiobooks (narrated by Scott Brick) are relentlessly exciting and ceaselessly entertaining. The books are best read in sequence as they build upon prior themes and relationships. There were two twists at the end that I didn’t see coming. It was fun reading and the storyline moved along quickly.
